research paper postgraduate from the year 2023 in the subject pedagogy school system educational and school politics grade 90 language english abstract this study aimed to identify and describe the challenges and barriers encountered by the students in modular learning this study utilized quantitative research design the researchers sent out an electronic survey via google forms to students the respondents were selected using convenience sampling technique using open ended questions and likert scale the following data were obtained demographics self assessment of capacity for modular learning and challenges and learning barriers encountered by the students in modular learning descriptive statistics were calculated under prevailing conditions the students considered themselves physically and mentally capable of engaging in modular learning challenges experienced by the students were classified to 4 categories individual domestic institutional and community barriers the study limited its coverage on the response of 217 students in eugenio cabezas national high school s y 2021 2022 research on distance learning is still in its early phases and there are very few studies which investigated the modular learning hence the findings of this study are of paramount importance for future learning continuity plans of educational institutions and stakeholders

a possibility but rather a requirement that foreign language teaching and learning should be enjoyable a teaching technique that is characterized by the elements of fun and play is the use of games hence this paper argues for the implementation of games as a teaching technique in the primary efl classroom and emphasizes the benefits of doing so regarding the positive impact it has on the language learning process although the pedagogical value of games in the teaching of english as a foreign language efl is generally acknowledged the usage of games in primary efl education is less documented and even less practiced since research on foreign language teaching and learning often focuses on older learners the inclusion of games in children's education has been studied but rarely with the focus on foreign language learning thus there is still a lot of research to do when it comes to teaching english as a foreign language playfully to primary school students

master's thesis from the year 2021 in the subject didactics for the subject english applied geography grade 20 university of duisburg essen language english abstract the overall aim of this master thesis is to examine which opportunities and issues within the virtual efl classroom could arise from distance learning in germany therefore the first chapter will examine the difference between homeschooling and distance learning since their definitions are not the same it is also relevant to look at different countries and their regulations and implementations for home schooling or distance learning in order to retrace the arguments for and against a possible implementation of homeschooling in germany the closure of german schools during the lockdown forced teachers students and parents to change over to distance learning as this adjustment has presented a challenge for all persons involved there is a need to identify appropriate tools and methods for the virtual efl classroom hence it is relevant to learn about the experiences of teachers who presented and students who attended online english lessons this will be done in form of online questionnaires which aim to identify appropriate digital resources for the virtual efl classroom as well as possibilities and problems that could arise from distance learning in efl the final step of this thesis is to develop a sample online english lesson in times of distance learning as an alternative possibility to a traditional english lesson in the class room on the basis of the results from the questionnaires therefore both perspectives teachers and students will be taken into consideration since their experiences help to improve distance learning in english the main goal of the development of this online lesson in english is to show that teachers are also able to fulfill the requirements of the curriculum in distance learning and bearing this in mind a possible implementation of a hybrid learning system could be an alternative way of learning and teaching for the future

accepted observation clark 2020 argues that distance education is not a very new model of education as cited in sari and naylor 2020 the emergence of distance education applications dates back to about 300 years one of the first known applications is weekly lessons delivered to students in the usa via mail as well as countries such as england switzerland and australia have provided distance education with different tools mail radio television etc years ago due to geographically dispersed and sparse population distribution this study is a descriptive correlational research which examined the significant difference between the extent of use of distance learning and self regulation learning skills and its effect to the demographic profile of the teacher participants in public elementary schools in the district of alfonso cavite specifically the study reported the demographic profile of the teacher participants in terms of age sex civil status the highest educational attainment and length of years in teaching examined the extent of use of distance learning in terms of access interaction response and results level of the students self regulation learning skills in terms of goal setting environment structuring task strategies time management help seeking and self evaluation and investigated the significant difference among these variables extent of use of distance learning and level of students self regulation learning skills when grouped according to demographic profile and determine as well as the significant difference between the extent of use of distance learning and level of students self regulation learning skills

master s thesis from the year 2024 in the subject pedagogy general grade 9 university of iceland faculty of diversity and education language english abstract this study delves into the experiences of migrant parents residing in iceland and their perceptions of their children s language learning journey in icelandic preschools with multilingualism playing a crucial role in today s diverse icelandic society understanding the perspectives of migrant parents is essential for fostering inclusive educational environments in preschools by taking a critical approach my primary focus will be on identifying and analyzing the short comings within the educational institutions of reykjavik city and their impact on migrant parents and their children s language development through qualitative interviews with six migrant parents in iceland through narrative analysis and an autoethnographic approach this research aims at shedding light on the experiences and challenges of migrant parents as their children navigate language acquisition in icelandic preschool settings while learning their heritage language at home i will also ask the question of how much of the policies of the national curriculum have been carried out in different

educational facilities inside reykjavik consequently i want to discuss if preschools in reykjavik stick to a multilingual policy or if they try to maintain a monolingual discourse for young children the parents i interviewed for this paper expressed concerns about communication issues with their children s preschools in iceland additionally they highlighted a perceived lack of staff in icelandic preschools leading to the perceived lack of communication the parents also felt that there was an overemphasis on the icelandic language this in turn made it difficult and frustrating for the children to communicate in their home or heritage languages the findings aim to contribute to a deeper understanding of multilingualism in educational contexts in reykjavik and aim at providing valuable insights for educators and policy makers to support language development and integration for migrant children there has been a long standing interest in multilingualism in icelandic preschools and the impact of the linguistically diverse upbringing of children in this country with my research i try to contribute to the ongoing discourse on multilingual education in preschools

thesis m a from the year 2023 in the subject english language and literature studies linguistics grade a urmia university urmia university west azerbaijan iran course teaching english language english abstract socio cultural theorists consider self regulation sr a vital personal characteristic that can guide individuals in reaching their personal and more importantly their learning goals specifically when learning languages is involved this necessitates empowering learners as far as their sr skill is involved thus training sr strategies among other measures seems to be a very important mission in language learning process the aim of the current study was therefore to expound the effect of training sr skills observation emulation self control and self regulation upon the writing skill through applying a package adopted from zimmerman s model 2013 the model encompassed 12 self regulated learning strategies self evaluation organizing and transforming goal setting and planning seeking information keeping records and monitoring environmental structuring self

consequences rehearsing and memorizing seeking social assistance and reviewing records that focused on the writing skill of 57 intermediate iranian efl learners in an online platform in the course of a semi experimental study the sr profile as well as performance in writing tasks of participants divided into two groups namely control n 30 and experimental n 27 were measured through a five point likert scale questionnaire as well as writing tasks both pre to treatment for homogeneity purposes and post to treatment for comparison purposes respectively results of a set of non parametric mann whitney u tests showed that training sr strategies did not significantly affect the writing skill of intermediate efl learners in the context of the current study given the limitations embedded in online platforms including technological shortcomings online learning and education literacy motivational factors etc especially in the context of iran it was concluded that although some training processes work very well in real classes they may not be effective in online courses consequently as far as an effective online instruction is involved the first step should be to overcome the shortcomings in advance and then online training of sr can be initiated

research paper postgraduate from the year 2023 in the subject pedagogy school system educational and school politics university of benin faculty of education language english abstract the study is aimed at assessing differential item functioning by school ownership in 2020 waec ssce west african senior school certificate examination economics multiple choice items to achieve the objectives of this study four research questions were raised and two hypotheses were tested the survey research design was adopted multi stage sampling procedure was used to select the sample for the study the population of the study comprised 21440 students in ss3 in benin metropolis who wrote the 2020 waec ssce the sample size for the study was two thousand one hundred and forty four 2144 ss3 students the research instruments used for the study was 2020 waec ssce economics multiple choice questions logistic regression analysis was used to detect dif while the hypotheses were tested using chi square statistical analysis all hypotheses were tested at 0.05 level of significance the findings showed that out of the fifty 50 items in waec 2020 economics examination question paper eight items function differentially by school ownership from the results of the hypotheses of the 2020 waec ssce economics the null hypotheses of no significant difference in the number of items functioning differentially by ownership was retained based on the findings it was recommended that test experts and developers should explore the use of logistic regression analysis to detect items with dif

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
