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aramaic peshitta new testament translation is a translation of the new testament into english that is based on the gwilliam text this translation includes explanatory footnotes marking variant readings from the old syriac eastern text and other peshitta manuscripts other footnotes provide cultural understanding and a system of abbreviations that mark idioms and figures of speech so that they are easily recognizable the translation is as literal as possible but with readable english giving the flavor and rhythm of eastern language aramaic is the language of the first century and the peshitta is the earliest complete manuscript of the new testament

this is a translation of the complete peshitta aramaic bible into english the 39 old testament books and the 27 new testament books the peshitta bible was very likely written in the 1st century ad the peshitta old testament is a translation of proto massoretic hebrew manuscripts similar to those from which the greek septuagint was translated in the 3rd century bc the new testament is the original new testament text from which the greek manuscripts were translated and disseminated for the greek speaking roman citizens of the 1st century this edition has no notes included to enable the author to fit all the books into one volume other editions of each testament are available with numerous notes hardback 8x11 b w 779 pages this is a deluxe edition printed on 80 glossy paper as a color edition even though it is black white there was no other way to print it on glossy paper thus the high cost the font used in this edition for

the scripture text is fairly close to the type used in william tyndale s translations from 1525 to 1535 and is used as a tribute to him and his magnificent work he was the first to translate the old and new testaments from their respective hebrew and greek manuscripts into english prior to that only the latin bible had been translated by john wycliffe william tyndale was sentenced to the stake strangled and burned in 1536 before he died he prayed lord open the king of england s eyes in 1537 tyndale s translation was published as matthew s bible it was recommended to henry the 8th by archbishop cranmer as the best he had read and it was installed in every pulpit in england by the king s decree sixty eight years later in 1604 king james the 1st commissioned a revision of tyndale s bible among 54 translators they retained 76 of tyndale s wording in the 15 hebrew old testament books he had completed before his martyrdom and 83 of his new testament wording the result was the 1611 authorized version commonly known as the king james version this translation is based on my peshitta interlinear bible a literal word for word aramaic english translation of the complete 66 book protestant canon of the bible published in 2018 i know of no other such translation of the peshitta bible available in the english language george lamsa s translation was mixed especially of the old testament where he often used translations of the hebrew bible not translating the peshitta text only as i have done

the vertical interlinear for the aramaic peshitta new testament in 3 volumes is composed in a non traditional vertical layout the english translation of the verse is written out directly above the list of individual words and corresponds to the translation from the aramaic peshitta new testament translation to the left of each individual english word or phrase is the corresponding syriac word and the dictionary number used by all of the light of the word ministry publications

the peshitta old testament unlike the peshitta new testament is a translation in this case it is a translation of the original hebrew bible what is especially interesting and valuable about the peshitta old testament is that it is represented in the oldest semitic manuscript of the complete old testament extant in the codex ambrosianus commonly dated to the 6th or 7th century ad the peshitta old testament is commonly believed by scholars to be a 2nd century ad translation i believe that it is older than that based on its readings and also on many of the headings of the psalms in western codex ambrosianus of the 6th century several of which actually date the original text in the 1st century a d i have not included these headings in my translation only the scripture text itself i hope to include these in a future edition as they are fascinating evidence for dating and locating the original work as well as the christian faith of the translators the peshitta old testament and new testament are quoted extensively by the persian bishop aphraates of nineveh who wrote bible commentaries in his native aramaic in ad 337 until his death in ad 367 i have read and compared his quotes to the peshitta old testament and the peshitta nt old syriac gospels other detailed studies of these quotations show that he was using the canon and text of the peshitta bible for both testaments as opposed to any conjectural old syriac bible the vestiges of which are supposed to reside today only in two partial manuscripts of the gospels which differ considerably from each other and are dated to the 5th century one ms is the curetonian another is the sinaitic syriac one great reference online with a detailed study of aphraates also called aphrahah is peshitta org paul younan a native aramaean and aramaic speaker from lebanon and member of the church of the east did a comparison of the syriac readings of aphraates with the peshitta and the old syriac text of the gospels as well as peshitta readings in paul s epistles the author s web site is aramaicnt wordpress com
