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for courses in historiography this textbook reader not only details the history of historical practice and explains historical theories and philosophies in language that is accessible to college

undergraduates it also provides excerpts to illustrate these historical approaches and help students to identify them in their own writing and in the writings of contemporary historians the book is organized into two main parts the first part traces the origins of contemporary american historical traditions to their roots in ancient greece and explains how the profession of history emerged and developed in europe and america through the nineteenth century the second part focuses more specifically on historiographical developments the united states since the nineteenth century

how to get started in arts and humanities research with undergraduates is designed for faculty members and administrators who wish to develop opportunities for undergraduate research scholarship and creative work in the arts and humanities since the scholarly norms definitions of research and roles of collaboration and individual study in the arts and humanities can differ from those in the sciences the book contributes new ideas for meaningful student participation in the scholarship of these disciplines and for connections to faculty work written by faculty with substantial expertise in working with undergraduate researchers the book's 11 chapters offer models of successful practice in a wide range of disciplines and cross disciplinary programs and demonstrate the integral role of undergraduate research in these disciplines

inner city sydney was the epicenter of gay life in the southern hemisphere in the 1970s and early 1980s gay men moved from across australasia to find liberation in the city s vibrant community networks and when hiv and aids devastated those networks they grieved suffered and survived in ways that have often been left out of the historical record this book excavates the intimate lives and memories of hiv positive gay men in sydney focusing on the critical years between 1982 and 1996 when hiv went from being a terrifying unidentified disease to a chronic condition that could be managed with antiretroviral medication using oral histories and archival research cheryl ware offers a sensitive moving exploration of how hiv positive gay men navigated issues around disclosure health sex grief death and survival hiv survivors in sydney reveals how gay men dealt with the virus both within and outside of support networks and how they remember these experiences nearly three decades later

historiography is the study of the methods sources techniques and theoretical approaches used by historians in developing history as an academic discipline the approach to the study of history is a very important aspect of historiography the development of history

has undergone a shift from traditional approaches of diplomatic political and economic history to the more modern aspects of social and cultural studies some influential historiographical approaches are comparative history ethnohistory gender history environmental history etc this book is a valuable compilation of topics ranging from the basic to the most complex theories and principles in the field of historiography different approaches evaluations and methodologies in this field have been included herein this book with its detailed analyses and data will prove immensely beneficial to professionals and students involved in this area at various levels

contains nearly 2 000 annotated citations primarily english language works divided into forth eight sections citations refer chiefly to works published between 1961 and 1992

offers readers an introduction to just under 30 critical and representative writings on the relationship between film and history these writings represent a combination of insights from film theory cultural studies historiography the history of cinema and film promotion and reception

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
