medical doctors driving taxis architects selling beer on street corners scientific institutes closed down amid rusting carcasses of industrial plants these images became common at the turn of the 21st century in many once modern civilized countries in quite a few of them long time neighbours came to kill each other apparently motivated by the newly discovered differences of religion language or origin civil nationalism gave way to tribal ethnic and confessional conflict rational arguments of geopolitical nature have been
